

## **Policy Recommendations**

This committee focuses on the areas of Accountable Policing, Housing (Recommendations), Economic Development, and Research.

Members of this Committee:

- collaborate with other committees within GTAAAC and among the other Title V commissions, along with community members, to provide voice for the broad policy needs of Tulsa's African American community members
- engage with the community to identify policy priorities of the Committee that need to be elevated to the City Council and the Mayor
- regularly share priorities and summary of findings with the Commission at the scheduled meetings so members are aware of broad policy-related needs and recommendations.



This committee focuses on the areas of Education, Housing (Informational), Health (Informational), and Economics.

Members of this Committee:

- collaborate with other committees within GTAAAC and among the other Title V commissions, along with community members, to address education and skill gaps of Tulsa's African American community members
- engage with the community to identify education and skill-building priorities of the Committee that need to be elevated to the City Council and the Mayor
- regularly share priorities and summary of efforts with the Commission at the scheduled meetings so members are aware of broad education and skill-building needs and recommendations.



### Culture & Engagement

This committee focuses on the areas of Culture, Health (Opportunities), and Communications.

Members of this Committee:

- meet with the Secretary for the Commission to ensure that highlighted calendar dates for events that engage the community are shared on the City's Social Media site for GTAAAC, along with crafting a way for community members to send messages to Commission
- engage with the community to identify representative events and news
- regularly share events and news with Commission at the scheduled meetings so members are aware of broad community happenings.
