2024 marked the inaugural year for the City of Tulsa's Asian Affairs Commission (AAC). Our primary goal in this inaugural year was to raise awareness within the community about the representation of our AAPI (Asian American Pacific Islander) citizens at the municipal level. We aimed to foster meaningful connections within the AAPI community, build bridges, and maximize our outreach efforts.

To achieve these objectives, we established three distinct committees, each focused on different aspects of community engagement:

- **Network Mapping**: Mapped the network of our commissioners to identify strengths and areas where additional perspectives were needed.
- **One-Pager Creation**: Developed a clear statement on who we represent to ensure transparency and inclusivity for all Tulsans.
- **Partnerships**: Engaged with organizations like **Tulsa Public Schools** to deepen our understanding of the needs of Asian Tulsans.
