PURPOSE OF THE CLASSIFICATION: Under general direction serves as director of programs in the Office of Health and Wellbeing, overseeing and designing programs and initiatives that are created to improve the health of Tulsans; and performs other related duties as assigned.

ESSENTIAL TASKS:

- Creates implementation plans, tracking systems, and evaluation frameworks for neighborhood and city-wide community health and wellness initiatives
- Manages multi-sector planning groups, committees, and working groups related to community health and community wellbeing
- Provides clinical leadership in the development and execution of programs that address physical health, mental health and social drivers of health needs
- Collaborates with healthcare institutions, community-based organizations, and city departments to design and implement evidence-based health initiatives
- Develops and maintains participatory community engagement strategies to gather feedback and improve program responsiveness and accessibility
- Identifies and recommends quality improvement interventions based on public health data, performance metrics, and community feedback
- Prepares and delivers regular reports, presentations, and briefings to City leadership funders, and the public regarding process
- Makes recommendations on funding proposals, budget planning, and resource needs to support sustainable, impactful programming
- Writes proposals and funding applications and oversees the implementation of grantfunded programs
- Reports to work on a regular and timely basis
