

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
**Al-Anon Family Group**

Many who come to Al-Anon/Alateen are in despair, feeling hopeless, unable to believe that things can ever change. We want our lives to be different, but nothing we have done has brought about change. We all come to Al-Anon because we want and need help. In Al-Anon and Alateen, members share their own experience, strength, and hope with each other. You will meet others who share your feelings and frustrations, if not your exact situation. We come together to learn a better way of life, to find happiness whether the alcoholic is still drinking or not.






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**Narcotics Anonymous**

NA was founded in 1953, and our membership growth was minimal during our initial twenty years as an organization. Since the publication of our Basic Text in 1983, the number of members and meetings has increased dramatically. Today, NA members hold nearly 76,000 meetings weekly in 143 countries. We offer recovery from the effects of addiction through working a twelve-step program, including regular attendance at group meetings.

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
**Celebrate Recovery**

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**Treatment Resources**

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### ActionSteps Counseling

We believe that it is better to treat the problem than to incarcerate the symptoms. The problem set before us is large but by working together it can be solved. ActionSteps Counseling is determined to be a part of the solution and the Arise program is just the beginning phase of that solution.




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### OSU Addiction Recovery Clinic



The OSU Addiction Recovery Clinic has a team of specialists who provide high-quality and compassionate outpatient care for those suffering from addiction to opioids, alcohol and other substances and behaviors. Services include: medications for substance and opioid use disorders; evaluation and treatment for co-occurring mental health disorders; withdrawal management; assisting with compulsive behaviors; counseling and behavior therapy, and support groups. Appointments are available in person or virtually at the Tulsa clinic, as well as virtually in rural health facilities across Oklahoma.

Our mission is to educate, treat, and support the community through means of integrated care, tailored to each individual's needs.

By looking at the entire person and addressing other healthcare or personal needs they have outside of their mental health diagnosis, we strive to help resolve other issues that may serve as trigger points or barriers, restricting their journey to a better tomorrow.



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### Tulsa Fire Department



The Tulsa Fire Department is dedicated to the protection of life, health, property and the environment by delivering quality life and fire safety services. The Tulsa Fire Department currently responds to over 57,000 incidents annually. (Approximately 33,000 are EMS related.) Our response area includes 201 square miles and approximately 400,000 citizens. The Department has an authorized strength of 676 members. There are 34 fire stations and five designated districts. Firefighters work 24 hours on duty and 48 hours off.

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
### Palmer Addiction Recovery Services

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# Infectious Disease Resources

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
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### SHOTS

SHOTS is a Tulsa-based program designed to prevent infection, injury, and fatal overdose.

Our mission is to make sure people have what they need to stay healthy, stay connected, and stay alive.




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### Muscogee Creek Nation

The Muscogee (Creek) Nation operates as a proud, self-determined government, grounded in centuries of resilience and visionary leadership. With origins in the southeastern United States and a rich history as one of the Five Civilized Tribes, we are the fourth-largest tribe in the country, serving a vibrant community of over 100,000 citizens from our headquarters in Okmulgee, Oklahoma.






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### OKHRA

Organized in 2018, OKHRA has been a leader in infectious disease elimination, public safety through medical waste cleanup and bio-hazard reduction efforts, providing education, outreach and wellness support for those in recovery. This last year has brought forth alliances with other groups and agencies to help create a unified front devoted to public safety. OKHRA is actively working toward self-sufficiency and 2026 will be a year of coalition building to further realize our mission.
